IACP EXCELLENCE AWARDS-2017

RECOGNISING OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTIONS OF ORGANISATIONS AND INDIVIDUALS

Outstanding Contributions Deserve Outstanding Recognition INVITATION FOR NOMINATIONS

IACP Excellence Awards:

The Indian Association of Colleges of Pharmacy Awards or IACP Excellence Awards is a national competition that encourages excellence and recognizes leadership in industry, academia, research and regulatory fields. IACP is a not for profit national organisation whose mission is to serve its member colleges and their respective faculty, by acting as their advocate at the national level, by providing forums for interaction and exchange of information among its members, by recognizing outstanding performance among its member educators and by assisting member colleges and schools in meeting their mission of educating and training pharmacists and pharmaceutical scientists.

We invite pharmaceutical industry, research institutions, universities, pharmacy colleges, regulatory bodies and individuals to send in their nominations for the IACP Excellence Awards 2017. The awards are for excellence in original research work in pharmaceutical sciences by Indian citizens and organizations. Non-Resident Indian's are also eligible for these Awards.

The 2017 Awards

These awards will be given biennially and consist of three excellence awards. Each award will carry a trophy, citation and a cash prize of rupees one Lakh (Rs.100000/-). These awards are not for a specific research topic or area of excellence, but for the overall contribution made by an individual or an organisation. The award will be considered as a onetime award for an individual or an organisation and will not be considered for this award for the second time. The nominations will be reviewed by a Panel of Judges, consisting of persons of eminence and are not members of IACP. The award presenting ceremony will be held during the biennial IACP Pharmaceutical Sciences Congress held normally in February / March of every other year. The awardees will be supported with travel (economy fare within India) and accommodation during the Congress dates. Awardees may be expected to deliver an oration on their work, as well as submit the manuscript for publication.

IACP Industry Innovation Award

Recognizes and celebrates innovative Indian enterprises across Pharma industry segments. This award recognizes and honor's the Indian Industry's brightest stars and to identify the top innovative organizations & start- ups in the country. This gives an opportunity to companies & start-ups to shine and be known nationally and internationally for their Innovative products and services. The awards are open to any kind of process, product, service, technological or any other type of innovation that have fueled growth through new ideas and approaches along with tangible results in the preceding years.

Eligibility Criteria

The application form has been designed to draw out achievements of the applicants on their own terms and to understand how the enterprise in entirety has come together for the effort. For each entry the panel of judges will assess the applications on its own merit vis-à-vis the stated evaluation criteria for that award. The usage of the term "innovation" is quite broad. It could denote innovation in terms of product, service, process, new venture, business model or any other form of innovation as envisaged by the applicant.

Assessment Criteria

- Focus on innovation within your enterprise
- Merit of innovations showcased

Weightage's

- Innovation Leadership: Innovation within an enterprise is a function of how people at all
 hierarchies collaborate for and support the journey. From the top rung to people on the shop
 floor, their personal qualities and competencies will affect the innovation capability of the
 enterprise.
- Innovation Management: Managing an innovation project requires dealing with unforeseen needs and risks. While managing innovation projects is challenging; creating and sustaining a vibrant culture of innovation is also key for the enterprise.
- Innovation Processes & Systems: All innovations begin as ideas. Translating ideas into
 visible, tangible results for the enterprise is a well-controlled process of taking the idea
 through various stages. Equally important is how the process has been integrated to create
 system within the enterprise.
- Innovation (40%): The innovation that is potentially disruptive or transformative is an
 exciting idea that moves away from the convention and breaks new ground. The innovation
 has been able to uncover unmet user needs and has been able to convert the identified need
 in to an actual offering.
- Market Opportunity (30%): The innovation has the capability to alter the market or has the
 capability to give rise to a totally new market and has a robust go-to-market strategy or an
 innovative business model.
- Impact (30%): The innovation will have a game changing future impact in its domain of operation or will impact the way things are done in that industry.

IACP Academic Innovation and Research Award

This award recognizes outstanding contribution to education and research in the built environment. It is open to academics and research organisation who have improved upon – or extended beyond – current expectations of best practice in education and research.

Eligibility Criteria: Submissions should cover any new education and/or research initiative relating to the built environment (e.g. new approach to teaching and learning, curriculum development, apprenticeship, skills, professional or policy development, research, etc.) that has improved upon – or extended beyond – current expectations of best practice. Submissions must provide brief and convincing answers to the following questions on the entry form. The answer to each question is limited to 300 words:

- What was the need that the innovation sought to address?
- Provide an overview of the innovation and explain why it was innovative?
- What were the challenges that had to be overcome to enable the innovation to come to fruition?
- What did you do to lead and move the innovation through to implementation?
- What were the achievements or improvements in terms of measurable outcomes?
- What were the overall benefits and/or impacts and to whom?

Drawings, photographs or supporting documents may be attached to the entry form if deemed appropriate. The attachment is limited to four A4-sized pages only. Submissions of joint innovation between research organizations and academics are welcome. Entrant(s) should be the individual(s) / institutions who did most to lead and move the innovation through to implementation. Name(s) of the entrant(s) who would be the recipient of the award should be made clear on the entry form. No individual / institution can make more than one submission.

Key assessment criteria for judging the described innovation are:

- Originality.
- Improvement in best practice.
- Significant benefits or impacts

IACP Regulatory Leadership Award

This award honors outstanding regulatory professionals/ organizations / agencies in the healthcare products sector. The award provides an important opportunity to acknowledge outstanding contributors to the regulatory field. The goal of the Regulatory Leadership Award is to recognize outstanding sustained leadership, mentorship, and outreach contributions to the field of Regulatory sciences and to the development of the strategic vision for the future direction of the regulatory field and its application of the circle of excellence Integration—Innovation—Impact to enhance research, development, regulatory evaluation and/or utilization of therapeutic products.

Eligibility: The candidate must be a Regulator or a leader who is actively advancing the scientific discipline of Regulatory Sciences and/or its impact on research, development, regulatory evaluation, or utilization of therapeutic products.

Nomination Process: Nominations are invited from academic institutions; regulatory agencies and pharmaceutical industry to be submitted with supportive documents. Nominations are evaluated based on innovation, design and contributions made to the advancement of Regulatory Sciences and medicine safety. Nominations should describe the justification for consideration of this nominee for the leadership award; include career highlights and impacts which demonstrate leadership contributions that have advanced the field of regulatory sciences.

The Master's Dissertation Award

This award is for outstanding research undertaken by students on taught postgraduate pharmacy courses. The award aims to promote the importance of advanced research skills in enabling students to pursue specialized careers.

- Premier Award (Rs.25, 000, trophy and certificate)
- Highly Commended Award (Rs. 15,000, trophy and certificate)
- Merit Award (Rs. 10,000, trophy and certificate)

Rules of Entry

- 1. The Nominating institution should be a member of the Indian Association colleges of Pharmacy. (The institutions are welcome to become members if not already a member)
- 2. Nominations for dissertations must be from taught postgraduate degree courses (from institutions approved by Pharmacy Council of India).
- 3. Nominee must have completed a master's degree in the year 2016.
- Dissertations must have been assessed as outstanding (75% or above marks or equivalent CGPA)
- 5. Each submission must be endorsed by a nominator from the relevant educational institution (e.g. dissertation supervisor, course director, Principal). The nominator needs to provide a recommendation reference (not exceeding 200 words) on the entry form to indicate why the nominee is deserving of consideration for an award.
- For each submission, an entry form must be completed and returned by post with a hard & soft copy(CD format) of the dissertation.
- 7. The number of nominations that can be made from a single institution is limited to two.

Selection Criteria: The dissertation must:

- Demonstrate a high level of academic attainment consistent with postgraduate study.
- Display a critical awareness of current issues and developments in the chosen subject.
- Be well-structured with a good standard of presentation.
- Contain clear aims and objectives.
- Show a critical review of existing literature or other scholarly outputs.
- Possess a well-justified research methodology.
- Obtain relevant data from appropriate sources.
- Include a clear interpretation and presentation of findings.
- Contain a clear and logical argument leading to appropriate and relevant conclusions.
- Set out recommendations for future research.

The IACP PSC Research Paper Award

The Research Paper Award is in recognition of the importance of research papers presented at the IACP Pharmaceutical Science Congress in developing and disseminating knowledge for the benefit of current and future, both as Podium and Poster presentations. The Award aims to celebrate individual excellence in research.

Prizes for Podium Presentation for each of the sections of the Industrial Pharmacy and RA/QA sections.

- Premier Award (Rs.15,000, trophy and certificate)
- Highly Commended Award (Rs. 10.000, trophy and certificate)
- Merit Award (trophy and certificate)

Prizes for Poster Presentation for each of the sections

Rules of Entry: In addition to the general rules of entry for the presentation of papers at the congress, the author should be a registered delegate at the IACP Pharmaceutical Sciences Congress and will have to present the paper in person and be available to jury to answer questions if any. The presentation should be original and should not have presented in any other conference or meeting or published in a peer reviewed journal. No individual can submit more than one research paper.

The research paper should:

- Demonstrate an original contribution to knowledge in the chosen specialism
- Demonstrate awareness of international research trends in the chosen specialism.
- Demonstrate a high level of critical analysis and appropriate use of primary and/or secondary data.
- Be understandable to the widest possible audience.
- Be well structured with clearly stated aims and objectives
- Critical analysis of previous work
- · Well-justified research methodology
- Convincing critical arguments and findings
- Clear conclusions and recommendations for practice

General Procedure for Applying

You are requested to send the nominations (except for the IACP PSC Research Paper Award) comprising of 5 bound sets, each set consisting of the following information:

- 1. Complete bio-data of the candidate or profile of the organisation with a list of best papers or achievements highlighting the important contributions in them briefly.
- 2. Awards already received.
- 3. Signed details of the excellence in research work / Innovation / leadership for which the nomination is being sent (approximately 10 pages).
- 4. Two specific publications/ research papers / recognitions relevant to the work and the award for which nomination is made.
- 5. Statement that the research work / innovation / leadership effort under reference has not been given any award earlier by the IACP
- 6. Signed consent of the candidate / organisation
- 7. Signed Justification for sponsoring the nomination, and
- 8. Signed Citation on outstanding research work by the nominator.
- 9. The nomination papers should be sponsored by the head of the institute / organisation or a person who is competent to review the work of the nominee.

The papers will be considered for presentation in poster session only. The abstract & summary must be submitted as an email attachment to **ssc.abs@iacp.org.in** on or before **15**th **February**, **2017**. No hard copies of abstracts will be entertained.

The paper acceptance information will be given on or before 20th February, 2017 to the same email id through which the abstract has been submitted and authors are requested not to submit more than one paper. Only one paper submission from one email id is permitted. Avoid multiple submission of the same paper.

Eligibility

The presenting author should be a student of final year B. Pharmacy or 4th year Pharm. D. (Regular) or Pharm. D., (PB) or M. Pharmacy or Ph.D. or anyone having above/equivalent qualification to Bachelor of Pharmacy. The presenting author should be a registered delegate for the IACP's first Pharmaceutical Sciences Congress - 2017, Bengaluru. For details about registration to the congress, refer IACP website.

Instructions for Preparing Abstract & Summary

For Abstract: The abstract of the work proposed to be presented should be prepared according to the instructions given below. The abstract should be **submitted only as an email attachment to ssc.abs@iacp.orq.in**

All abstracts must be submitted only in English and format your abstract as a 'MS Word document' (MS Word -2007 or above). The abstract must be single-spaced and in upper and lowercase letters (Times New Roman Font; Size: 12). The text must not exceed 250 words including title, author details and key words. It should be prepared in the following format: Aim/Objective, Methods, Results and Conclusion. List not more than four key words related to your research. Tables, graphs, and charts are not permitted in the abstract. Underline the presenting author's name and affiliation (use appropriate abbreviations for institution with city, state, country and code).

Do not use titles; i.e. Dr., Ph.D., etc. Avoid reference to name of institution, location or funding sources in the body of the abstract. The presenting author only shall present the paper and the name cannot be changed later. Maximum number of authors including the presenter **should not be more than four.** Do not mention affiliations of co-authors.

For Summary: A two page summary, as a separate attachment is compulsory and should be prepared strictly as per the given guidelines. Title of the paper only should be present and avoid reference to author/coauthor's name and affiliation. The summary should be presented in the following sequence: Introduction, Objectives, Experimental Methods, Results & Discussion, Conclusion and Important references (Vancouver style of referencing). Tables, figures and graphs may be included.

Since the paper is to be coded for evaluation, the author is requested not to mention any names and address on the summary pages.

Submission Permission: The Indian Association of Colleges of Pharmacy (IACP) does not assume any liability or responsibility for publication of any submitted paper.

Originality of scientific Work: The presenting author is requested to submit the work, only if it has not been presented earlier as a total work or any part thereof has not been published in any form. Author should withdraw the paper, if it is published between the time of submission and the presentation at the congress.

Declaration Form: At the time of Poster presentation the presenting author needs to submit an author declaration form.

Note: The decision of Vice— Chairman (Scientific) of the IACP's 1st Pharmaceutical Sciences Congress—2017 will be final and binding in any matter related to scientific paper submission and presentation
